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God Doesn't Need Your Perfection. He Honors Your Surrender.

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The woman Micha'ela is today looks very different from the woman she once believed she needed to become. The transformation wasn't the result of a new strategy, a larger platform, or greater opportunities. It was the result of surrendering her life to Christ and allowing Him to reshape her identity from the inside out.

Today, she is a full-time content creator, soon-to-be published author, and Bible teacher committed to helping women grow in their relationship with Jesus Christ. Through Bible studies, digital ministry, and her upcoming book, ***City Girl to Godly Girl***, she is encouraging women to understand that lasting transformation begins before circumstances change. In fact, it begins with surrender.

When Success Isn't Enough

Before Micha'ela began leading women in faith, she had already built a well respected online platform.

Micha'ela shared that her journey into content creation started in high school after asking her parents for a camera to create YouTube videos. Over the next several years, she learned the ever-changing world of digital media, discovering that success online required constant creativity, consistency, and the willingness to evolve.

Still, the growth of her platform never answered the deeper questions she was carrying about identity, purpose, and who she was becoming.

Looking back on her content journey, Micha'ela admitted that much of it was rooted in a desire for validation. Much of her audience consisted of men, and much of her identity had become intertwined with the attention and affirmation social media provided.

Although her platform continued to grow, she now recognizes that success could not provide the identity or security she was searching for.

The Turning Point

Valentine's Day 2021 became the turning point for Micha'ela. After years of embracing New Age beliefs and spiritual practices she now recognize as idolatry, Micha'ela rededicated her life to Jesus Christ.

Recommitting her life to Christ didn't immediately change her circumstances. But in many ways, it exposed the places where healing and growth still needed to take place.

She openly shared that shortly after, everything began to unravel. *"Literally I lost everything within about a month,"* Micha'ela recalled. That season included spending time in jail after a fight. But rather than questioning God's faithfulness, she eventually came to understand that following Christ did not remove every battle. It just changed how she walked through them.

Losing everything became the place where God began rebuilding everything for her.

God Rebuilt What Life Had Broken

One of the most defining seasons of Micha'ela's journey came through a 90-day fast from social media.

For someone whose career had been built online, stepping away required more than discipline. It required trust. During that season, distractions were removed, priorities were reordered, and God's voice became clearer than the noise she had spent years listening to.

Looking back, Micha'ela no longer sees that season as one of loss. She sees it as the place where God stripped away every identity that wasn't rooted in Him. For her, what once felt like isolation became preparation.

From Platform to Purpose

As Micha'ela continued growing in her relationship with Christ, God entrusted her with a new assignment.

About a year and a half ago, she sensed Him giving her the title of what would become the foundation for her first book: ***City Girl to Godly Girl***. It became the framework for telling a story that countless women carry in silent; the tension between who the world rewards and who God is calling them to be.

Drawing from her own journey, Micha'ela shares practical encouragement for women navigating identity, relationships, healing and spiritual transformation while reminding readers that God doesn't ask people to clean themselves up before coming to Him. He transforms them after they surrender.

Leading with Grace

Leadership has changed Micha'ela as much as ministry has. She admitted that learning to lead women has required continual growth, particularly as someone who once struggled with people-pleasing.

Today, she approaches leadership differently. Rather than leading from performance or perfection, she seeks to lead from grace, recognizing that every woman God places before her is somewhere along her own journey.

Whether hosting Bible studies in Houston, creating digital content, or preparing to expand gatherings into other cities, Micha'ela hopes women encounter more than encouragement. She hopes they encounter Jesus.

A Legacy of Redemption

When asked what legacy she hopes to leave, Micha'ela's answer wasn't centered on influence, followers, or book sales. Instead, she wants her life to become evidence that redemption is possible.

She hopes people remember that no one has to become perfect before coming to Christ, they just have to surrender.

As a mother, she also hopes her greatest ministry will be the life she models for her child; a life that demonstrates obedience, faithfulness, and complete dependence on God.

Her encouragement to anyone wondering if they've gone too far is simple. God has never been intimidated by brokenness. He has always been in the business of making all things new.
